Subiaco's first ordination in 30 years

Bishop Anthony Taylor ordained Brother Patrick Boland, OSB, to the priesthood on Saturday, June 20, at St. Benedict Church at Subiaco Abbey. Abbot Leonard Wangler, OSB, and other priests in attendance celebrated the 10 a.m. ordination Mass, which was followed by a reception in the PAC Lounge. In his homily Bishop Taylor noted Fr. Patrick's successes in various careers prior to his "call," his vocation to monastic life and to the priesthood. The newly ordained priest celebrated his first Mass at St. Benedict Church on Sunday, June 21, at 10:45 a.m.



Fr. Patrick earned a master's degree from Saint Vincent Seminary in Latrobe, PA, on May 8. He earned a bachelor's degree in theology from St. Gregory's University in Shawnee, OK, through the Little Rock Theology Institute in 2011. He began discerning the priesthood after he professed his solemn vows as a Benedictine monk and permanent member of Subiaco Abbey in 2010.

Fr. Patrick, originally from Northeast, PA, volunteered with youth groups and worked in campus ministry, as he began discerning a religious vocation. He came to Subiaco for a vocations retreat in July 2003 and returned in July 2004 for a second retreat. After that retreat he applied to join the abbey.

In September 2005 he became a candidate at Subiaco Abbey. Six months later, he became a novice and in 2007, he made his first profession as a Benedictine and took the name Patrick. In 2010 he earned a bachelor's degree in professional studies with an emphasis in communications from Arkansas Tech University in Russellville and began teaching religion and Scripture at Subiaco Academy.



"O God, I only want to do, what you ask, in the way you ask, for as long as you ask, because you ask," a quote from Pope Clement XI, is listed on the prayer card celebrating Fr. Patrick's ordination. He said he chose this quote because it best describes his vocation in serving the Church, first as a monk, and now as a monk and priest. "These words have been my watch words in all that the Abbey has asked of me. They sustain and inspire me to serve God and the Church. (They are) the reason for my entrance into monastic life at Subiaco. Now they take on additional meaning in 'being present' to all, as 'an icon of Christ, the priest,'" Fr. Patrick said, to help him describe the significance of the quote.

2015 Camp Subiaco

Forty-six alumni and parents volunteered to staff the two sessions (June 14-20 and June 21-27) of Camp Subiaco 2015. Two hundred thirty-five campers from eleven states enjoyed the two camping sessions. Boys, ages 9-13, arrived at Subiaco from Arkansas, Texas, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Mississippi, Florida, Kansas, California, Georgia, Illinois, and Missouri. Activities include fishing, swimming, water basketball, tubing, archery, go-karting, riflery, canoeing, zip line, climbing wall, outdoor games, and outdoor camping. Traditional favorite camp activities are box hockey and fishing.

Twenty-four students served as counselors-in-training.







Construction updates:

Fuhrmann Hall: Stone work continues along east, west and south elevations. Stonework is complete on the north side except for minor tie-in at top of wing walls. Steel stud framing is being installed for exterior soffits. Drywall finishing is underway. Electrical, HVAC and plumbing rough-in is virtually complete at first floor, basement rough-in continues. Approximately 50% of the new concrete drive/parking has been poured. Permit has been obtained for tie-in with Highway 197.

Main Entry: The existing concrete floor at first level has been cut for the new stair. Vertical steel support has been installed and extends through the basement floor. Plumbing is being installed for the new bathrooms adjacent to the new first floor stair landing. Relocation of the HVAC system to allow for the stair continues.

Tennis Courts: New fence posts are set around entire perimeter. The west half of the new post-tension concrete slab was poured on 6/22. The east half was poured on 6/29. New top-of-the line basketball goal sets have been ordered.
