Logan Kremer '15 began a new chapter in his life on July 1, 2015. On this day, also known as Induction day (I-day), he started his transformation from civilian life to military life at the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD. Through hard work, dedication and discipline he fulfilled a life-long dream.

I-day started at 7:30 a.m. with the processing into the Academy. After a very long day, at 6:00 p.m. he took the Oath of Office with his father, Retired U.S. Navy Commander Frank S. Kremer, Subiaco Academy Class of 1984. He was allowed 30 minutes with his family before entering the doors of Bancroft Hall, his new home for the next 4 years.

Alumni Association Secretary Dale Schumacher '71 recently received an offer from Gary Gilbert '75, younger brother of Jack Gilbert '71. Dale explains: "Substance of call was very impressive in my opinion and what a story it is. When his daughter married she chose as her wedding colors orange and blue. Being

the dutiful father of the bride, Gary bought orange and blue cloth napkins for the reception. Only a true Subi guy would do that in my opinion. I would almost bet that there has not been a daughter of a graduate in the history of the SAA that has shown such devotion and dedication to her father. The following several paragraphs came from a former Academy boxing coach.

Henry Prados Pitard '57, sent an old picture of himself setting the World Masters squat record in the over-40 class, 181 lb. division with his 545 lb. squat at the 1981 Louisiana State Power Lifting Championship in New Orleans. Prados, who began his weight lifting and boxing at Subiaco, admitted that weight lifting "was more my thing than boxing; at least the weights don't want to beat me up." Prados plans to be here in 2017 for his 60th, and hopes classmates Peewee Myers and McCrate and other classmates will make it.

Louis Seiter '56 of College Station, TX, says he has "good grass for his small Brangus herd." Brangus is a cross between an Angus and a Brahman. Like most Arkansas ranchers who wind up in Texas, Seiter is doing his weight lifting hauling hay. Voted the outstanding boxer at the 1956 Arkansas Golden Gloves held in Fort Smith, he was awarded the Barney Sugarman Trophy (Boxing's Heisman) and remained undefeated in Arkansas. One of his target dates in 2016 is his 60th Alumni Reunion. Louis and wife Barbara have been generous benefactors in the recent drive conducted by the Abbey.

Michael Vogler '63 died July 17, 2015, from complications during heart bypass surgery. At Subiaco he won the Math Medal as a Junior and as a Senior. At UALR, he earned a math degree. From an early age, Michael possessed a deep belief in non-violence and was ready to risk all for his beliefs.

As a pacifist, Michael refused to obey his draft for the Vietnam War and was arrested and sentenced to three years in federal prison in Springfield, Missouri, where he served two years and 19 days of that sentence. On January 21, 1977, Michael and all Vietnam objectors were pardoned by President Jimmy Carter in one of the first acts as President.

During the time of his imprisonment, the Subiaco Boxers had several boxing matches in Springfield. One of the Subiaco boxers was Joe Cicone '66 (open quality) whose father was Superintendent of the Federal Prison. As a result, Fr. Nicholas and Jim Limbird, Rufus Stewart (Vietnam veteran) and others easily obtained visitors' passes to see Michael. Michael spent his entire career working with or for at-risk kids. Governor Clinton appointed him to the State Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board.

Michael was very involved in the Catholic Worker Movement. (The Founder is now in the stage of an "interested

person,” on the road to canonization). He ran an underground newspaper at UALR. A master bridge player, Michael is described as “an extremely quiet and humble man who did not talk about his many accomplishments in the field of social justice.” A celebration of his life was held in the basement of St. Edward Church in Little Rock.

,Br. Reginald (Richard) Udouj, OSB ‘79 and Br. Cassian Elkins will make solemn profession of vows as monks of Subiaco Abbey at Mass on August 8, 2015, in the Abbey Church. Having completed the period of triennial vows, these two professed this life-long commitment as Benedictine monks.
